




SCRAPES & SCRATCHES





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SO YOU WANT TO PAINT YOUR OWN CAR?

DIY Advice from Sammy Scheib

Your project has been on your mind now for weeks and you have asked questions about what to do, and everyone said go for it. So here you go. You have to get tools if you don't have any so at the last swap meet you looked and found some hammers and some dollies. This is a good place to find tools because many people have retired or have taken the trip to the big body shop in the sky and left their tools behind.

The old timers would make a lot of their tools so if you find something that looks weird it may have been made for some special repair. Don't discount something because it is not new or look like something off the shelf at the tool store. Good hammers are expensive but taken care of will last 2 lifetimes. Body hammers are NOT carpentry hammers. DO NOT use a body hammer to hammer in nails. If you find a good body hammer with nicks in the face you will have to clean it up. If you try to work out the metal with a hammer with a messed up face the metal will have all the nicks in it from the hammer.

To clean up a hammer face take a fine file and smooth off the face. Be careful not to change the shape of the hammer face. Then polish with some fine sand paper to get a shinney smooth face. Now you will be ready to get to the metal and start working it smooth. Start with an area where you can reach both sides. If you are working on a quarter panel you can put the dolly in the inside and tap from the outside. Check to see if there is any undercoating on the inside of the panel you will be working. If there is clean it off because this will cause you to have many problems when you work out a dent. If you get any undercoating on your tools clean them off with lacquer thinner and keep on going.

Now let's look at the panel you will be working. Rub your hand over the panel to feel any dents. Use a pencil to mark the dents you find. Most dents you will have will be from doors of other cars or shopping carts or things like

that. These dents are from the outside in so we call these innies. If some one had jack stands or a boom boom box in the trunk and they slid all over and hit the inside of the panels they would put dents going out. These are called outies.

When you have a dent, you have to reverse it to repair it so let's take the innies first. Put your dolly on the inside of the panel and start to bump it out by using the dolly as a hammer. With your hammer on the outside tap the area around the dent as you bump it from the inside. As you work the metal you will determine how hard to hit the metal to move the dent around. What you want to do is make the panel flat as it was before the dent was put into the panel. While you bump and tap you also need to feel the panel so you know how much to be tapping. Over working a panel can give you more problems than you need. With the outie dents work them opposite from the innies. Tap them from the outside in.

When working these you can keep your dolly on the inside and tap from the outside with your hammer. As you work the dent you will be holding the dolly on the bump of the dent and pushing it while you tap from the other side. You should use a bump tap bump tap to move the metal. Again, tap the outer ring of the dent as you bump from behind. This is called hammer off dolly repair. As the dent begins to flatten you can move the dolly and hammer to the center and softly tap the metal till you hear the hammer and dolly meeting. This will give you a ring sound. This is called hammer on dolly repair.

Have you ever put a penny on a train track to have a train run it over? The penny will get squished and never look like a penny again. This can happen if you hammer a dent on a panel with heave blows to the dolly. The metal will stretch and give you the problems you did not want. If you get to this point you have been beating the metal too hard. If you have done this the metal will do what is called oil canning.

You can push it in and it will pop right back out. Boink is what you will be hearing. Sometimes it sounds like bloop bloop.

These sounds you do not want to hear. If you have achieved this sound you will have to heat shrink the metal. This could be found on roof panels too. In the old days people would sit on the roofs at drive ins and watch the movie. The next day in the sun there would be a big ring around the windows in the rear and front from caving in the roof. These rewards are still found today on some cars.

Let's say you haven't come to these cross roads and you have flattened out your dents and dings. Now use a grinder with a 36grit disk on it to clean up the panel. Use a 7-inch disk to clean off the panel. A 5-inch disk will work too but the bigger the disk the more it will help you to flatten the metal so you can put your bondo on. Always be thinking about what is going on when doing anything with tools. Wear a face shield when grinding. Think of this Covid thing and look like some of the people you see in Costco shopping. A face mask keeps grinding debris from your face and eyes and a breathing mask will keep the dirt out of your nose. If you happen to see anyone in Costco that looks like that ask them if they do body work. Maybe they could answer some questions for you.

Remember this, there are many roads that will lead to a town you are going to. Everybody may say the road you are on is the wrong road. Same with body repair. Choose the best road that works for you and do a good job. This can also give you subjects to debate at your local cars and coffee shows. Hang in there. Sammy, nephew of Earl.

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What the heck is a Kaiser / Frazer?? That is a question I OFTEN hear at car shows and outings when I drive my 1954 Kaiser Manhattan. Is

it German? What does it have to do with Kaiser hospital? Who made the Kaiser?

Well boys and girls, sit down on your beach blanket and listen quietly while I tell you the story of Henry Kaiser, the car builder, ship builder, dam builder and road builder....

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Henry Kaiser began his career as a road builder in the late 20's and early 30's. Ultimately, he helped build the Hoover dam and the Panama highway. He moved on to build the "Victory ships" in Oakland to aid our efforts in the WWII (one of those ships

introduced to Joe Frazer, of Graham - Paige. The two men formed an independent car company in late 1945 called the Kaiser/ Frazer automobile company. The company would offer 2 vehicles, the Kaiser being the lower priced vehicle, and the Frazer Manhattan being the "Upscale" more expensive unit.

The first cars rolled off the assembly line at Willow Run,

Mich. in 1946. As time progressed, sales dropped and Joe Frazer left the company in 1952. The Manhattan badge was then applied to the Kaiser line. As finances struggled, models were modified, and a new "Compact" car was added: The little HENRY J. Also the first "Station Wagon type SUVs"were introduced, the "Traveler" and the "Vagabond". Also, in 1954, the Kaiser DARRIN entered the arena with one of the first fiberglass bodied sports cars in America. Even with these changes, Kaiser/ Frazer only lasted into 1955, building just

over 300 cars in America that final year. Working with our local club manager, Neil

Well VW fans, its almost summer! The birds are singing, the sun is out and it's a perfect time to cruise in your vintage VW!

Taking my own advice, I recently took my 55 Bug out for a Sunday spin. Sunroof open, vent windows popped out (what are THOSE?) and the radio tuned to classic rock! (In MY day, it was just ROCK... it took 50 years to become "classic")

Blaring on my radio was IRON BUTTERFLY's... IN-A-Godda-Da-Vida! If you don't recall the song (Or weren't born yet) That was a 17-minute blurred and slurred rendition of an intended love song that only underground radio stations would play for its entire duration. The lyrics and title were SUPPOSED to say " In The Garden Of Eden", but the band was so messed up at recording time, that's the way it came out. Pretty much anything could become a hit in 1968!... You had to have been there... VERY interesting times! But we still have the legacy with us... Just hop in your old VW, crank on the radio to classic rock, and sing along to In-A Godda-Da-Vida! You'll probably sound better than they did!!

In 1969 I was working at one of the largest VW dealers in Southern California... Economotors, Riverside Calif. I was training as a mechanic and saw my fair share of "Hippie Buses" and "Psychedelic" bugs in the shop. Additionally, I was VERY much into rock music, putting me in the company of that group of people who were known as the "Long Hairs"

A VERY high...(if you will pardon the term) percentage of those people were VW owners. It kinda made sense... The VW was cheap to buy, cheap and simple to maintain, and had LOTS of room to haul band

My Tire is Smarter than Your Tire!

It had to happen sooner or later. We have Smart Cars, Smart Phones, Smart Laptops, Smart TV's and, well, a few smart people. The very latest in tire development would be of course, Smart Tires! Seriously!

There are some variations, but basically there can be a sensor built right into the tire that monitors tread wear, air pressure, your driving habits, where you go, speed, driving conditions, warning of maximum speed approaching, and more. Goodyear already has some on the road with light delivery vans and McLaren has a version on its SuperCars. Of course, tire companies can get sellable information on your driving habits also, which they can use in marketing. I expect all of the major tire manufacturers will have this feature available soon if not by now.

These smart tires are unlike the long available TPMS (Tire Pressure Monitoring System) valves that are pretty standard on most of todays cars in the form of a valve stem and tells you when you have low air pressure which can rapidly lead to a blown out tire from overheating and disintegrating. I have seen so many damaged tires come in to my shop and the customer claims "it just blew out!". In reality, tires extremely rarely do that.

There is always a reason such as road hazards of many types, collisions, potholes, punctures and more. I once had a customer come in with a tire that had been run with no air pressure, all torn up that they purchased about a month beforehand, mad as hell and demanded a new tire because this one "just blew out".

Upon examination, we found a 9/16" box end wrench had penetrated the tire, the entrance closed up but left the wrench inside. Clearly a road hazard not covered under warranty. One of the pressure sensor valves would have warned of the puncture and maybe averted this loss if the

driver immediately stopped and a repair could be made, so take heed. The wrench was added to our container of similar objects including, ½ pliers, nails and screws, wood splinters, screwdrivers, razor blades, bolts, etc.

Last, you probably know that some performance tires are designated "Run Flat", meaning you can drive a short distance on them with ZERO air pressure. This is accomplished basically with very stiff sidewalls that will prevent the tire from running against the rim or surface until you can get it repaired or replaced VERY SOON, only a few miles! Normally these have an electronic attachment to your instrument panel so you can see the problem immediately. Some high performance cars with these tires do not even have spares , so you stop and call AAA.

Another last.... A subscriber recently asked for my opinion on Nitrogen filled tires benefits and if the cost was worth the benefit. YES, is my answer on that. But it has to be done correctly or it does not work. All air must be vacuumed out of the tire and replaced with pure nitrogen. Just letting the old air out and putting in Nitro does not work because there would still be some regular air left in the tire.

Benefits are longer tire wear, consistent air pressure and cooler running according to the marketing companies. If you get a small puncture and loose pressure, you cannot put regular air in without losing the benefit of the Nitrogen and you have to vacuum and refill with the pure Nitro.



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



You know your full-size sport-utility vehicle test drive experience is going to be different when the big brute shows up wearing racing stripes.

Meet the Dodge Durango SRT 392 AWD, a three-row sport-ute with the soul of a Dodge Charger.



Under the hood is finely crafted 6.4-liter Hemi V-8 rated at 475 horsepower. And oh, what it can do! For starters, it makes the zero-to-60-mph run in 4.1 seconds.

But that's just a small part of the story.

The power plant on the tester was so robust that I had to get used to the idea that it was propelling a big-shouldered SUV

around like it was an overloaded muscle car. "Should I really be going this fast in a vehicle this size?," I kept asking myself.

I felt like I was thumbing my nose at nature, and physics.

What took me even longer to get used to was learning to go from a standing start without bolting forward like a bucking bronco. Whoa, boy!

Honestly, the eight-speed transmission hookup was like a hair trigger, and several times I lurched away from intersections and looked like a 16-year-old getting his first minutes behind the wheel of an old-school Corvette.

Once settled down, I was able to appreciate the fact that I was riding in the lap of luxury.

The base price on this hot rod SUV is \$65,877, but the bottom line on my sticker read a lofty \$82,757. Was it loaded?

Yeah, like the Presidential Suite at the Four Seasons.

Besides the long list of stateof-the-art safety technology and driver-assist features, the opulent interior included suede touches, a wireless charging pad, a power liftgate, a rear seat video system and carbon fiber interior accents.

For me, all this added up to a serious family vehicle, with plentiful room for cargo and multiple entertainment options for kids young and old. You

could take this Durango on the road for weeks and feel right at home ... make that comfortably at home.

You will need to pay for gas, however, and the tester's fuel mileage ratings of just 13 miles per gallon in the city and 19 mpg on the highway require careful calculation, given today's fuel prices.

This Durango is geared to motorists who have some money to spend, and for a



luxurious experience and high-performance rush, this SUV is a likely investment for those fortunate folks.

I hope someone steps up and provides funding to this small independent team, they sure could use it. If nothing else order a T-Shirt from them, I did.
